Surrey Hills Primary School is looking forward to a productive and enjoyable year of learning in 2024 and would like to advise you of the voluntary financial contributions for next year. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

SHPS is proud of our enhanced educational program and activities delivered to our students and makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all families.

This is achieved through bulk purchases of classroom requisites, which ensures the added advantage of all children having access to identical materials. In addition, SHPS continues to invest in IT hardware, software, networking and support to deliver outstanding programs, thereby eliminating the need for parents to provide personal IT devices for onsite learning.

Furthermore, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for your assistance, whether that's through supporting our teaching staff, fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer and is very much appreciated.

Some Curriculum Contribution areas have increased slightly from the 2023 amounts due to the higher costs to the school for consumables items such as stationery, workbooks, curriculum and IT necessities as well as upkeep of the school grounds. We appreciate that families are experiencing higher costs of living currently so have tried to keep increases as minimal as possible, while still ensuring that the school remains in a stable financial position into the future.

Payment Methods

Payment Using Compass

The Compass Parent Portal enables you to do the following:

- Update your registered email and mobile number (used for SMS alerts)
- Pay school fees, charges and contributions
- Approve or enter upcoming or past absences for your child

Parents are encouraged to utilise this payment option for the 2024 school year. Compass is a web-based system that is accessible on any modern web browser or by using the *Compass School Manager* app available for iOS or Android devices. Financial Support for Families

Refunds

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE CAMPS, SPORT AND EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF) FOR 2024

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount for a primary school student is \$150.

ANTICIPATED ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR PARENTS FOR 2024

CAMPS:

Students in Years 4, 5 and 6 will be attending camps during 2024. Costs will be confirmed for parents with as much notice as possible.

Camps, like excursions, are aligned to the school curriculum and therefore provide an important and enriching connection to student learning. Our school camps meet DET's framework risk management and accountability policies before being approved by School Council. School camps will not operate if the minimum number for costs is not achieved. As per our Camps and Excursions Policy, refunds cannot be given if the refund will cause a financial loss to the school.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
