Surrey Hills Primary School is looking forward to a stable and productive year of learning in 2022 and would like to advise you of the voluntary financial contributions for next year. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

SHPS is proud of the enhanced educational program and activities delivered to our students and makes every effort to keep the cost of items and activities to a minimum and affordable for all families. For the 2022 school year, the school is pleased to inform families that the cost of the Curriculum Contributions has reduced from 2021.

This has been achieved through bulk purchases of classroom requisites, which ensures the added advantage of all children having access to identical materials. In addition, SHPS continues to invest in IT hardware, software, networking and support to deliver outstanding programs, thereby eliminating the need for parents to provide personal IT devices for onsite learning.

Furthermore, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for your assistance, whether that's through supporting our teaching staff, fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Payment Methods

Payment Using Compass

The Compass Parent Portal enables you to do the following:

- Update your registered email and mobile number (used for SMS alerts)
- Pay school fees, charges and contributions
- Approve or enter upcoming or past absences for your child

Parents are encouraged to utilise this payment option for the 2022 school year. Compass is a web-based system that is accessible on any modern web browser or by using the **Compass School Manager** app available for iOS or Android devices. 2021 Credits

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, some curricular and extra-curricular activities were unable to proceed in 2021. Most families had prepaid these activities as part of the 2021 fee collection process (such as camp deposits, swimming and incursions/excursions). All parents who prepaid in 2021 will receive a credit for the balance of unspent monies. These monies will be directly credited against the 2022 fees/contributions when making fee payments in Compass. Please note, amounts will differ between year levels and individual students due to the different activities in which students participated over the course of the year.

Refunds

Surrey Hills Primary School aims to provide a fair and equitable refund system. Students who exit SHPS during the year will be entitled to a refund on a pro-rata by term basis. Please contact the school for a copy of the Refunds Policy.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE CAMPS, SPORT AND EXCURSIONS FUND FOR 2022

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount for a primary school student is \$125.

ANTICIPATED ADDITIONAL COSTS FOR PARENTS FOR 2022

CAMPS:

Students in Years 4, 5 & 6 will hopefully be attending camps during 2022. Costs will be confirmed at the parent information nights. It is important for parents to attend these information sessions.

Camps, like excursions, are aligned to the school curriculum and therefore provide an important and enriching connection to student learning. Our school camps meet DET's framework risk management and accountability policies before being approved by School Council. School camps will not operate if the minimum number for costs is not achieved. As per our School Refund Policy, refunds cannot be given if the refund will cause a financial loss to the school.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions	Other Contributions	Extra-Curricular Items and Activities
Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.	Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.	Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES
